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20 selected for Leadership Council Bluffs program

Twenty people have been selected to participate in the third Leadership Council Bluffs class.

John W. Balk, chairman of the membership-selection committee, said this year's nominees were interesting and difficult: interesting because there were so many highly qualified Council Bluffs leaders who were recommended and involved; difficult because the committee had to struggle with the task of narrowing the field of candidates to 20.

Leadership Council Bluffs is a project of the Council Bluffs Chamber of Commerce designed to sharpen leadership skills. It involves participants in a yearlong program focusing on their own skills, helping them sense current and future needs of the community and exploring strategies to positively confront and deal with these challenges.

By offering opportunities to interact with former and current community, county and state leaders, the program gives participants a chance to exercise their skills and benefit from the experience seasoned leaders.

Balk said Leadership Council Bluffs participants will meet once each month from October through May in a variety of activities designed to focus on individual and group leadership development.

The opening session Oct. 12-13 will be a retreat for participants to become acquainted and work in a leadership seminar.
